

Swiss participation opportunities in Erasmus+ cooperation projects 2023

Since 2014, Switzerland has no longer been associated with Erasmus+. However, Swiss institutions still have the opportunity to participate in Erasmus+ cooperation projects (under Key Actions 2 and 3) as an institution of a 'non-associated third country' for certain funding instruments.

The following table provides an overview of participation opportunities for Swiss institutions (green = eligible).

In case Swiss institutions are eligible to participate, they usually have two options for doing so:

1. As 'full partners', Swiss institutions must significantly add value to the project, but in return they can apply for EU funds (symbol: E+).
2. As 'associated partners', Swiss institutions present their participation in the project in the EU application, but finance their participation with funds outside Erasmus+. For certain funding instruments, they can apply for funding through the Swiss Programme for Erasmus+ (symbol: SPE+). Swiss institutions can otherwise participate with their own funds or funds from other funding institutions.

Swiss Programme for Erasmus+: If the requested contributions exceed the available funds, the applications - together with applications for cooperation projects under the 'International Programme' - will be considered according to the following criteria in the following order of priority:

- a. Contribution of the individual cooperation projects to the further development of the Swiss education system and its stakeholders in an international context, taking into account the geographical framework as defined in Article 2 of the Ordinance on International Cooperation and Mobility in Education (VIZMB);
- b. Benefit of the individual cooperation project for the specific needs of a particular education sector;
- c. Degree of commercialisation of the institution or organisation, prioritising non-commercial institutions and organisations.
