Communities of Practice tackle complex challenges in today's rapidly evolving academia, such as **internationalization, improvement of teaching excellence, creating welcoming joint campuses**, other **university innovations** at home or alliances that require **cross-disciplinary and/or cross-border collaborations**. Communities provide a collegial, structured yet flexible, well-facilitated framework for achieving bottom-up change, professional development, or a more collaborative way of international cooperation.

The Masterclass “Driving Change Collaboratively: Facilitating Communities of Practice” **is an intensive course for future Facilitators of Communities**, to build their competencies and confidence to set up and run their own Communities. An international team of mentors will share their experience with academic communities within their institutions and across Europe and the USA. As outcome by the end of the masterclass, each participant will have created their own Community Project Plan capable to designing, running and sustaining a community of practice.

Masterclass will support the participant to:

- Explore key features of Professional Learning Communities and networks and learn how to set up, and facilitate a community with colleagues, fostering inclusion, collaboration and problem-solving.
- Acquire novel strategies to support Internationalization at Home (IaH) at their own institution.
- Widen their skill set in facilitation and embracing intercultural diversity in academic communities.
- Develop their own Community Project in your institution/alliance to drive innovations.
- Get expert feedback addressing challenges while they start up their own community.
- Experience being part of cross-institutional network of like-minded leading professionals.

Target group of participants (20-25 participants)

- Academic instructors, Educational/ Curriculum Developers, Heads of international relation offices, academics in charge of Internationalisation at home, European University Alliance and partnership Coordinators, University Leadership.

Masterclass features:

- **Kick-off 17 June 2024: One-day In-person Session in Bern Switzerland (venue tba)**
- **4 x 2 hours Online sessions** (90 min workshop plus 30 min Q&A session)
- **Self-guided learning** between sessions (approx. 5 x 90 min)
- **Collaborative Engaged Network:** sharing, exchanging, and peer support
- **Virtual Learning Space** support (Padlet with activities and course materials)
