

Background and outlook







European Universities will set up a:



European campus: European curriculum (customisable, European degree) and mobility for an increased number of students, increased staff mobility for teaching/research/working, better access for lifelong learners and learners with fewer opportunities...



Challenge-based university approach with transnational European teams, collaborating with buinesses and reginal actors and addressing grand societal challenges: innovative learning and training approaches, strong links with local ecosystems...



Shared vision & strategy: joint governance model, shared, integrated, long-term strategic vision on education, research, innovation and service to society...



Key principles for the pilots under current Erasmus+





4 bottom-up networks consisting of 4-6 HEI per Call for Proposal (CfP)



Not an exclusive club



Accessible to different types of HEI (UAS, UTE, classical universities)



Ensure a good geographical balance



Flexible model of partnerships with no «one-size-fits-all» model



Erasmus+ as the main driver, in synergy with Horizon 2020, structural funds and national funding



Activities that could be funded under pilot action



Support for administration and coordination to implement joint activities such as:

- developing joint and flexible curricula
- fostering links with actors in education, research, innovation and society
- Developing joint services and infrastructures

Support for new types of mobility such as:

- short-term mobility for bachelor/master students and doctoral candidates for research purposes
- short-term mobility of doctoral candidates/researchers/non-academic staff for knowledge transfer



...the European Council calls on Member States, the Council and the Commission (...) to take work forward with a view to:

(...)

 strengthening strategic partnerships across the EU between higher education institutions and encouraging the emergence by 2024 of some twenty 'European Universities', consisting in bottom-up networks of universities across the EU which will enable students to obtain a degree by combining studies in several EU countries and contribute to the international competitiveness of European universities
