

In a nutshell - what's new in 2024

International Programme

- Funding menu options HigherEd: 15'000 CHF, 30'000 CHF, 60'000 CHF
- Deadline: 28 March 2024
- Newcomers strongly encouraged

- Swiss Programme for Erasmus+

- Deadline Cooperation Partnerships, Innovation Alliances: pending (usually 2 weeks after EU deadline)
- Deadline European Universities: 20 February 2024

Both programmes

- New application platform > you need a new account
- Slightly adapted application form

How to select the appropriate grant from a fixed menu

Estimate the overall project costs

(e.g. 60'000 CHF)

Identify the most appropriate grant you want to apply for (30'000 CHF = 50% Movetia co-funding \checkmark)

Adapt project budget to the grant chosen if necessary

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What makes up a good cooperation project?

Stages of a cooperation project

Phases (all partners actively participate in all phases)

- 1. Planning (defining needs, objectives, project and learning outcomes, activity formats, timetable, etc.).
- 2. Preparation (planning of activities, development of work programme, practical arrangements, confirmation of target group(s) of planned activities, elaboration of agreements with partners, etc.).
- 3. Implementation of the activities including the implementation of the results in your institutions and dissemination during and after the project.
- 4. Follow up (evaluation of activities and their impact at different levels, and use of project results).

Key features of a cooperation project

- → Is the project idea relevant?
- Are the project concept and the implementation plan convincing?
- → Is the project team capable of achieving the project goals?
- → Are the partner agreements substancial?
- → What are the intended results and are they meaningful?
- → What impact are you aiming to achieve and how?

Do's (& Dont's)

- Relevance > demonstrate the necessity for the project and the international cooperation (include data, research etc.) & that the project addresses Movetia funding criteria
- Coherence: Project objectives > needs of the target groups > activities and deliverables
 - ->Less is more > activities > budget
- Quality of your results > define indicators and evaluate
- Expected impact > wide group of beneficiaries, beyond your department or institution > outline how you plan to integrate & share



Spotlight: Why dissemination matters

International cooperation in **education** feeds its internationalisation and supports its progress

- Maximising the impact of your project results
- Building resources at your own institution
- How can a result be anchored and prevent the effect from vanishing?
- How can dissemination be measured within a longer-term dimension
 - -> Integration of the results into existing work
- Collaboration with other Swiss institutions

Formation of clusters for collaboration within your institution
